- Kindness Board of Directors and Sponsors
- Kindness Ambassadors College Age Ambassadors who help with training, videos, speaking, assemblies, and PKA training
- Connection with school boards and community leaders

Kindness Club Faculty and Advisors

- One Faculty Member and one advisor assigned to oversee and lead
- Trained by Kindness Ambassadors on the State Level in Aug of each year- Online training is also available

High School Kindness Club Team Leaders

- Nominated by classmates
- Trained by an adviser
- Attend a class every B day in their school schedules
- Kindness club adviser teaches class, provides training
- Put on 1 assembly in each Elementary school assigned to them
- Visit each Elementary school assigned to them 1 time and teach lesson in classrooms.

High School Kindness Club

- Run by Kindness Team Leaders
- Anyone can join
- Meets monthly after school or at lunch
- Monthly Kindness in Action activity/ service project
- Help with assemblies and elementary school visits

Junior High Kindness Club

- Nominated by classmates
- Trained by an adviser

- Attend a class every advisery
- Kindness club adviser teaches class, provides training

Elementary School Kindness Club

- 2 Students per class chosen by Teachers
- PTA Kindness Club parent rep or Head Teacher
- Meet once a month during school or after school
- Go back and teach what they learn to their classrooms after the meeting each month.

Training for Kindness Clubs

Online Training for Kindness Clubs

- Online Training will be available for Principals, Faculty, Advisers and Student Team leaders including inspiring videos, speakers, and ideas for their Kindness week or month.
- Every adviser and team leader receives "PKA training"
- PKA training is Putting Kindness into Action.
- The training includes: What is Kindness, the benefits of Kindness, putting Kindness into action, and teaching Kindness to others. How to implement this in your schools.
- Outlines for monthly themes and how to teach and implement
- A monthly video is provided to be used within their schools with their Team Leaders and Advisers.
